Report 16: Medicaid Home and Community-Based Services, 2001.

Published by NIDRR. Presents estimates of program participants and expenditures, including breakdowns by specific populations and types of services. **NARIC Accession Number O14125**

Report 15: Transitions in Employment and Disability Among People Ages 51-61 (2000).

Published by NIDRR; analyzes transitions in disability and employment from 1992 to 1994. Estimates the incidence of disability and explores the effect that developing a disability has on maintaining employment. **NARIC Accession Number O16786**

Report 14: Mobility Device Use in the United States (2000).

Published by NIDRR; focuses on the population using devices, providing a detailed profile of their demographic characteristics. **NARIC Accession Number O13570**

Report 13: Computer and Internet Use Among People with Disabilities (2000).

Published by NIDRR. Uses data from current surveys to demonstrate that gaps in computer and Internet use based on disability status are just as large as those based on race and ethnicity. **NARIC Accession Number O13402**

Report 12: The Employment Experience of Persons with Limitations in Physical Functioning (1999).

Published by NIDRR. An analysis of the 1996 California Work and Health Survey, this report describes the differences between persons with and without physical disabilities over a wide range of employment characteristics, including the qualitative aspects of employment. **NARIC Accession Number O13325**

Report 11: A Profile of Adults Needing Assistance with Activities of Daily Living, 1991-1992 (1997).

Published by NIDRR. Provides a profile of the noninstitutionalized adult population needing assistance with activities of daily living and estimates the size of the population eligible for federal personal assistance services benefits under different ADL, income, and age criteria. Also describes current sources of ADL assistance by recipient type. **NARIC Accession Number O12411**

Report 9: Income and Program Participation of People with Work Disabilities (1997).

Published by NIDRR. Examines the relationships between the prevalence of work disability, program participation, and economic well-being. **NARIC Accession Number O12200**

Report 8: Families with Disabilities in the United States (1996).

Published by NIDRR. Provides statistical information on US families with members having disabilities: selected demographic and socioeconomic characteristics, and utilization of health services by families with and without members with disabilities. **NARIC Accession Number O12084**

Report 7: Disability in the United States: Prevalence and Causes, 1992 (1996).

Published by NIDRR. Presents data on the prevalence of disability in the community, its sociodemographic distribution, the severity of disability, and the chronic disorders, injuries, and impairments that cause disability. **NARIC Accession Number O11974**

Report 6: HIV/AIDS, Disability, and Employment (1996).

Published by NIDRR. Provides a baseline profile of HIV-related health status, degree of functional limitation and depressive affect, recipientship and denial of publicly funded disability benefits, private and publicly funded health insurance coverage, labor force participation, and illness-related changes in employment status. **NARIC Accession Number O11813**

Report 5: Medical Expenditures for People with Disabilities in the United States, 1987 (1995).

Published by NIDRR (1995); focuses on the economic impact of disability and presents the results of an analysis of the medical care expenditures on non-institutionalized people with disabilities. **NARIC Accession Number O11761**
